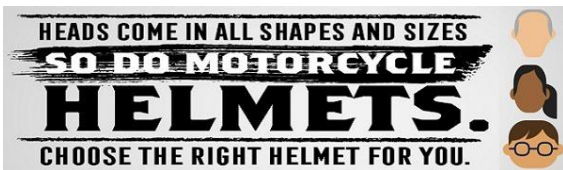

CHILD SAFETY SEAT INSTALLATION



Parents, grandparents, and anyone else who drives with young children in the car should be able to handle child safety seats properly. That's why AAA offers free child safety seat checks, during which trained technicians will make sure your child's car seat is installed safely and correctly. These seat checks are offered year-round, from 9 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Monday through Friday. Contact AAA Tidewater Virginia to make an appointment at 757-233-3889.



While motorcycling offers riders a sense of freedom, riding a motorcycle doesn't offer the structural protection that a motor vehicle does to keep riders safe in the event of a crash. That's why motorcyclists need to get special rider training, and wear special gear to protect their bodies and

make them more visible. In a motorcycle crash, the best protection for your brain is by wearing a DOT-compliant motorcycle helmet. Motorcyclists, and their passengers, wearing DOT-compliant helmets, increase their chances of survival significantly over non-helmet and/or vanity helmet wearers.

FACT:

According to the Center for Disease Control (CDC) - The National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health (NIOSH), **MOTOR VEHICLE CRASHES ARE THE LEADING CAUSE OF DEATH AMONG WORKERS IN THE U.S.** Wearing a seat belt is the single most effective thing you can do to protect yourself in a crash. According to the most recent Cost of Motor Vehicle Crashes to Employers, crashes cost employers more than \$47 BILLION DOLLARS. It takes about two seconds to buckle your seat belt to reduce your chances of injury or death in a serious traffic crash by nearly half. BUCKLE UP!

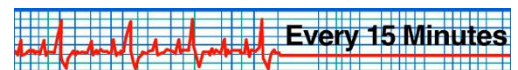

JULY IS NATIONAL THEFT PREVENTION MONTH

Motor vehicles are the primary mode of transportation for most of us, and often, an indispensable part of our lives. Having said this, nearly \$6 billion was lost to motor vehicle thefts in 2017.

What would happen if yours suddenly disappeared?

- In 2017, of all motor vehicles stolen, 75% were automobiles.
- An estimated 773,139 motor vehicles were stolen in 2017.
- 0.8% increase when compared with 2016 estimates.
- 10% increase when compared with 2013 estimates.

FACT:



- Of the 37,461 motor vehicle traffic fatalities in the United States during 2016, 1,233 (3%) of those killed were children.
- An average of three US children from birth – 14 years old were killed each day in traffic crashes during 2016.

- Child safety seats are 71% effective in reducing deaths for infants in passenger cars.
- They are 54% effective in reducing deaths for children ages 1 – 4 in passenger cars.
- Children who have outgrown child safety seats should remain in a booster seat until they've reached their eighth birthday* In addition, they must be at least four feet nine inches tall, 80 lbs. and/or fit correctly in the vehicle's seat belt alone.

NHTSA AND THE AD COUNCIL LAUNCH NEW PSA CAMPAIGN TO COMBAT DRUG-IMPAIRED DRIVING

Marijuana-impaired driving is becoming more of a road safety issue. So, **NHTSA** and the **Ad Council** have joined forces to launch their first joint drug-impaired driving prevention campaign. This new national public service announcement (PSA) initiative aims to change the cultural conversation around driving after using marijuana so it's seen as a universally unacceptable behavior, just as these partners previously changed public perceptions of drunk driving with their iconic "*Friends Don't Let Friends Drive Drunk*" campaign.

Our message is: ***If You Feel Different, You Drive Different.***

Don't get behind the wheel after using marijuana.

FACT:

Last year in Virginia, 24,350 distraction-related crashes killed 126 people and injured 13,733. * Distracted driving is any activity that diverts attention from driving, including talking or texting on your phone, talking to people in your vehicle, fiddling with the stereo, entertainment or navigation system - anything that draws your focus away from the task of driving. Fiddling with a phone is one of the most dangerous forms of distraction. It involves your hands, eyes, and attention.

TOP TIPS FOR AVOIDING DRIVER DISTRACTION:

- Enable the "Do Not Disturb" feature on your phone.
- Install a "Do Not Disturb" app that detects when you are driving.
- Enter addresses into your GPS device before driving.
- Don't fiddle with Infotainment System features while the vehicle is in motion.
- Never reach for something that has fallen or slid away from you.
- Avoid eating, drinking, smoking, and other distracting activities while driving.
