DRINK RESPONSIBLY, EVEN FROM HOME...

Activity restrictions are making 2020 look a little different than expected. A new at-home routine may affect drinking habits, so encourage friends and family members to stay on track with their health goals by drinking responsibly. Share these tips on how to monitor drinking habits from home and create a safer drinking routine:

- Check your drinking habits. The first step to monitoring your drinking is to understand your drinking habits. Notice how you're doing and set a goal.
- Stay on track. Mark down each drink before you have it. Make sure your drink recipes stay within the standard drink limits.
- **Team up with a buddy.** If you decide to cut back on drinking, do it with a buddy and try other activities together instead of drinking (like a virtual workout).
- Slow down on stocking up. If you're looking for ways to drink in moderation, buy smaller amounts of alcohol. Also, consider swapping out booze for fizzy drinks like flavored sparkling water or non-alcoholic beers.
- Pair with plenty of water. Remember to drink a glass of water with every alcoholic drink. This will help you practice responsible drinking and enjoy the drinks you have.

Consider if your drinking tolerance has changed. Your tolerance might be lower from staying home and not going out as much (and that's okay!). Think about how alcohol may affect you and remember standard drink sizes so you can make smart drinking decisions.

INFORMATION ON ROADSIDE EMERGENCIES

Multiple state agencies have come together to provide guidance to motorists to keep them and others safe in the event of an emergency incident, minor vehicle crash while traveling, or a vehicle breakdown.

The most important reminder is the need to use caution and common sense –because every incident is unique. To be ready for the unexpected, motorists and passengers are encouraged to:

- Prepare their vehicle in advance to avoid and minimize emergencies,
- Assess the situation when a roadside emergency occurs,
- Use good judgment in deciding how to respond, and
- Stay vigilant for other motorists because roadside emergencies are fluid situations that can change in an instant.

CRASH RATES: DRIVERS IN THEIR 70S BELOW MIDDLE-AGED DRIVERS



Better health, safer vehicles and various policy interventions have prevented a spike in crashes as a result of the aging U.S. population. Drivers in their 70s are now less likely to be involved in a fatal crash than those in prime working years. Not only do drivers in their 70s now have fewer fatal crashes per licensed driver, but they also have fewer police-reported crashes per mile traveled than middle-aged drivers.

TECHNOLOGY COULD 'GREATLY REDUCE' REAR-END CRASHES INVOLVING LARGE TRUCKS: IIHS STUDY

Installing crash prevention technologies on the front of large commercial trucks may reduce, by more than 40%, crashes in which those trucks rear-end another vehicle, according to a recent report from the Insurance Institute for Highway Safety. IIHS Director of Statistical Services Eric Teoh analyzed data from about 2,000 crashes involving large trucks that occurred from 2017 to 2019. He found that forward-collision warning systems reduced rear-end crashes by 44%, while automatic emergency braking systems reduced the crashes by 41%. Additionally, these technologies were found to reduce overall crashes by 22% and 12%, respectively.

FACT:

Drivers who violate the new law will be subject to a \$125 fine for the first offense and \$250 for each subsequent offense. Violations that occur in highway work zones also will carry a \$250 fine. It still is permissible to use hands-free technology to make or receive phone calls while driving—the ban only prohibits drivers from directly handling their devices.

If drivers must use their phones while traveling, they must be lawfully parked or stopped to do so. Drivers using a handheld device to report an emergency are exempt, as are the operators of emergency vehicles who are engaged in their official duties. Motorists also may handle amateur or citizens band radios.

NHTSA manages vehicle safety recalls, sets vehicle safety standards, and requires automakers to recall vehicles that have safety defects or do not meet those standards. During Vehicle Safety Recalls Week, NHTSA wants to increase awareness of the urgency of safety recalls and to encourage the driving public to check and see if there's an open recall on their vehicle.
