DMV UPDATE:

The Department of Motor Vehicles has reviewed the 2020-21 Virginia TREDs crash data on pedestrian crashes, fatalities and injuries. The preliminary data results indicate a need to continue to help educate our communities on pedestrian safety.

Pedestrian crash data totals in the Commonwealth of Virginia were as follows:

Preliminary Data	Crashes	Fatalities	Serious Injuries
2020	1205	115	356

Early 2021 data depicts a very obscure picture. Not one of the 14 fatalities occurred in the same jurisdiction. Fifty percent of the pedestrian fatalities involve people over 50 years of age. The leading pedestrian action continues to be "crossing not at an intersection."

TIPS TO SHARE WITH YOUR COMMUNITY

To stay safe on the roads, pedestrians, bicyclists, and motorists need to respect each other. Drivers should look out for pedestrians by avoiding distractions and drive in relation to Conditions as well as adhering to speed limits.

Pedestrians should:

- Plan a route with safe crossings
- Avoid distractions, alcohol and drugs, and be alert
- Dress to be seen, wear reflective clothing, but never assume drivers see you
- Carry a blinking light or flashlight at night
- Walk on sidewalks and if there's no sidewalk, walk facing traffic and as far from traffic as possible

Watch for cars backing up, especially in parking lots and driveways

When walking, pedestrians should be predictable, follow the rules of the road and obey signs and signals. They should cross at crosswalks or intersections – where drivers expect pedestrians.

While crossing, pedestrians must look for cars in all directions, including those turning left or right, and make eye contact with turning drivers before proceeding when possible.

If there is no crosswalk or intersection, pedestrians should:

- Go to a well-lit area with the best view of traffic
- Wait until there is enough time to cross safely
- Continue to watch for traffic while crossing.

2045 LONG-RANGE TRANSPORTATION PLAN: CANDIDATE PROJECT EVALUATION AND PRIORITIZATION REPORT

A core function of the HRTPO, the metropolitan planning organization (MPO) for the Hampton Roads area, is to develop and maintain a Long-Range Transportation Plan (LRTP). The LRTP is a blueprint for planned transportation improvements over a 20-year planning horizon based on the

vision and goals of the region. Since 2016, HRTPO staff has been coordinating with regional stakeholders and the public to update the LRTP to the horizon year 2045.

The recent launch of NETS first-ever comprehensive Drug-Impaired Driving Campaign, developed through a cooperative agreement with the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA), was a great way to kick off the year as the topic has become one of the more pressing

risks to employers and employees alike. Drug-impaired driving, also known as drugged driving or driving under the influence of drugs (DUID), has become a primary concern for traffic safety professionals and a major concern for employers. Using the information and materials provided in NETS "Drug-Impaired Driving for Employers" toolkit, employers can take action to educate employees about the dangers of drug-impaired driving, how to detect impairment from drug use, and how to prevent drug-impaired driving in the workplace. https://drugfreedrivingatwork.org.

NATIONAL GAS PRICE AVERAGE RISING TO PRE-PANDEMIC LEVELS

At \$2.31, the national gas price average is at its highest in 10 months. Pump prices have increased despite gas demand falling from 8.1 million b/d to 7.4 million b/d - the lowest level recorded since the end of May 2020.
