DMV: THUNDERCLAP MESSAGE

messages that will be shared simultaneously by participating agencies at the designated days and times. Each has 280 characters or less to ensure it can be tweeted. Prince William will be posting these thunderclap messages on Facebook, Twitter and Instagram.

Friday, 6/24 Thunderclap message for 5pm

When driving a vehicle in Virginia, you are considered #DUI if your BAC is 0.08% or higher. If involved in a vehicle crash & an officer has probable cause, you can be arrested for DUI within 3 hours of the #crash without a warrant & at any location. #DesignateBeforeYouCelebrate

JULY IS NATIONAL THEFT PREVENTION MONTH

Motor vehicles are the primary mode of transportation for most of us, and often, an indispensable part of our lives. In 2020 alone, more than three quarters of a million vehicles were stolen in the United States, costing vehicle owners more than \$7 billion:

- 804,400 motor vehicles were stolen in 2020.
- Only 56% of all stolen motor vehicles were recovered.
- Of all motor vehicles stolen, 74% were passenger vehicles.

DMV: FOURTH OF JULY

Many revelers choose to drink alcohol during Fourth of July celebrations, so Virginia DMV encourages its partners to educate citizens about the dangers of drinking and driving from June 30 through July 4, 2022. DMV partner WRAP's Act Like It campaign tells drivers that if they're old enough to drink alcohol, they should "act like it" by never driving after drinking. FACT: In 2020, 493 people died in motor vehicle crashes over the July 4th holiday period (6 p.m. July 2 – 5:59 a.m. July 6, 2020). Forty-one percent (201) of those fatalities occurred in alcohol-impaired-driving crashes.

COMING SOON - 2022 SPEED PREVENTION CAMPAIGN: JULY 20 - AUGUST 14

To help reduce the number of speeding fatalities on the roads, NHTSA is developing a new 2022 safety campaign to remind drivers that Speeding Wrecks Lives:

- Speeding Catches Up With You (social norming)
- Speeding Slows You Down (enforcement)

FACT:

In 2020, there were 11,258 people killed in speeding-related crashes, accounting for 29% of all fatal crashes in the United States. Additionally, 87% of all speeding-related traffic fatalities on American roads occurred on non-interstate roadways.

VIRGINIA DOT DEPLOYS V2X GEOFENCE FOR WORKZONES

A fully functional V2X smart work zone technology system was deployed May 23-25 in a work zone along U.S. Route 23 in Wise, Virginia.

The system is expected to decrease injuries and fatalities in roadside work zones by providing early detection of threats and quickly informing workers and drivers of dangers. Designed to protect roadside workers and motorists, the works zone system creates a digital boundary and alerts workers when they approach its edge, keeping them safe from potential hazards.
