SCHOOL TIME TIPS



Tips for Motorists: Be alert and slow down when driving in neighborhoods with school zones. For those school districts returning to campuses, obey the "flashing signal light system" used for school buses. **Yellow flashing lights** indicate the bus is preparing to stop to load or unload children. Motorists should slow down and prepare to stop their vehicles.

Red flashing lights and extended stop arms indicate the bus has stopped and children are getting on or off. Motorists must stop their cars and wait until the red lights stop flashing, the extended stoparm is withdrawn, and the bus begins moving before they can start driving again.

The 2022 JOHN T. HANNA AWARDS: Recognizing Traffic Safety Excellence in Hampton Roads

In 1991, Concerned Citizens Advocating Traffic Safety (the previous name of Drive Safe HR) instituted the JOHN T. HANNA AWARDS. Named after Virginia's "Father of Transportation Safety", these awards honor those who share Mr. Hanna's tireless dedication and commitment to improving traffic safety on Virginia's highways. *https://www.drivesafehr.org/get-involved/john-t-hanna-awards/*

AWARD CATEGORIES

Lifetime Safety Achievement Award: Presented for lifetime achievement in the area of transportation safety.

Employer Safety: Presented for employers who have taken the extra initiative to promote traffic safety and encourage their employees to practice safe driving behaviors.

Martin H. Schlosser Award for Traffic Safety Activism: Presented for outstanding efforts in educating citizens and changing attitudes and behavior regarding transportation safety.

Roadway Innovations: Presented for Individuals and/or organizations that show exemplary achievement in the design and/or implementation of highway engineering techniques, technology, and innovative approaches.

Impaired Driving Prevention: Presented for encouraging the prevention of drunk, drugged, drowsy, and/or drugged driving.

Law Enforcement Initiatives: Presented to a law enforcement department or individual who has shown extra initiative above and beyond the normal duties to promote and encourage traffic safety within their community.

Legal: Presented to attorneys, judges, or legislators who have actively supported safety issues thus strengthening existing laws and creating new laws that impact communities to help improve or reduce highway safety-related behaviors.

Messaging/Media: Presented to individuals or organizations, including but not limited to media representatives or news outlets, that have created messaging, used an innovative outreach method, or have helped spread the word about traffic safety through reporting or programming.

Occupant Protection: Presented for promoting and encouraging the use of safety belts and/or child safety seats through creative and innovative programs and activities.

Transportation Safety: Presented for developing approaches in the public and/or private sector, encouraging, educating, and/or promoting traffic safety to improve safety for drivers and riders.

Youth Traffic Safety: Presented to persons or programs educating youth and spreading the message on the importance of youth traffic safety.

Fire/Emergency Medical Services: Presented for actions at crash scenes or for activities or efforts that have a broader impact on improving at-scene safety and/or survivability and injury reduction for victims.

Eligibility, Rules, and Notification:

Any individual, business, organization, or governmental agency in the Hampton Roads and Eastern Shore area, which promotes community traffic safety, i.e. sober driving, use of safety belts, bicycle \or pedestrian safety, motorcycle safety, incident management, etc., is eligible for nomination. 2021 JOHN T. HANNA AWARD winners are not eligible for 2022 nomination.

Eligible activities, programs or materials are those that were initiated, completed, published, or produced in the period from October 1, 2021 to September 30, 2022. Entries must be received by November 18, 2022.

C Suffolk Police Department's Post

Suffelk Police Department

Last week the Suffok Police Department Noter Carrier Unit joined with other Hampton Roads law enforcement agencies to conduct a regional inspection of trucks and large vehicles. This initiative is referred to as the Specialized Transportation Safety Committee of Drive Safe Hampton Roads. The inspections performed by this group are performed on a monthly basis and ensure that all trucks and motor carriers are abiding by strict rules that are designed to protect motorists and local infrustructure and readmays.

This month, the Safety Committee conducted a total of 46 inspections which resulted in the identification of 76 vehicle violations, 45 DNV IIIIS brake checks, 7 vehicles that were put out of service until repairs could be completed, 2 size/weight violations, 1 chiver that was disqualified from driving, and 1 overweight citation. Citations from these inspections result in revenue that is disbursed to the City by the DMV.

Officer Gadwin is a member of the SPD Motor Carrier Unit and has been on the team for over 5 years; he originally began his career in law enforcement with SPD in 1976 before transferring to the Virginia Beach Pelice Department as a Fatal Crash Team Investigater and Motor Carrier Safety Officer. Officer Godwin returned to the Suffalk Police Department as a part time Motor Carrier Officer in 2016 and has performed a valuable service to our community as he conducts inspections and helps keep our roadways safe.

FACT: A child is involved in a crash while riding in a passenger vehicle, on average, every 25 seconds. When installed correctly, car seats can reduce the risk of fatal injury in a crash by 71% for infants and by 54% for toddlers.

Effective Tuesday, August 30, 2022, DMV is launching a new Oversize/Overweight (OS/OW) permitting system, EZ Haul.

With the launch of this new system, here are some changes that you (LEO's) may see roadside:

- The new permits will have a slightly different layout.
- You may see two different looking permits for up to two years. Some carriers may still have valid permits from our old permitting system.
- We have included a QR code on all permits issued from our new system. With this, you can utilize most smartphones and tablets to scan the QR code and it will display associated permit details you can confirm and compare against the permit you are presented with.

FACT: In 2021, 60 teens between the ages of 15-19 died on the roads of the Commonwealth with 9 of those fatalities in Hampton Roads, according to the Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV). Lack of a seat belt accounted for 5 teen deaths in Hampton Roads out of the 33 unrestrained teen fatalities statewide.

GET IT TOGETHER CHALLENGE

The **GET IT TOGETHER** (GIT) Challenge is being held this year from October 17 - February 10. Drive Safe Hampton Roads, in partnership with AAA Tidewater Virginia, Christopher King Foundation, State Farm®, and the Virginia Department of Motor Vehicles, provide the resources and the students teach each other to Buckle Up! GIT emphasizes educational awareness activities and uses unannounced seat belt observation checks to monitor progress. The Challenge Kit has undergone an overhaul for this fall. Lots of new community resources and links have been added to this year's program. School principals have until September 14th to sign up for this year's program.
