FACT: Last year, on the day of the game, there were 36 alcohol-related crashes on Virginia roadways, which resulted in 15 injuries and two deaths. Hampton Roads saw 25 crashes and 1 fatality, with 4 of those crashes involving alcohol during the 12-hour Super Bowl Sunday 2022 Timeframe.*

According to NHTSA, about 32 people in the United States die in drunk-driving crashes every day — that's one person every 45 minutes. In 2020, 11,654 people died in alcoholimpaired driving traffic deaths — a 14% increase from 2019.**
