# 2023 OLD, USED, BORROWED AND ABUSED CHILD SAFETY SEAT ROUND-UP



Thank you to our sponsors: Walmart, AAA Tidewater Virginia, Hoffman Beverage Co., Waste Management of Virginia, and the Children's Hospital of the King's Daughters. Together, we removed XXX old, used and potentially unsafe child safety seats from circulation. Remember, Virginia law requires all children under the age of eight to be properly restrained in an approved Department of Transportation (DOT) child restraint.

In addition, all children ages eight through seventeen years of age must be properly restrained in a safety belt while seated in any seating position in a vehicle. # TIPS TO SHARE WITH YOUR COMMUNITY

To stay safe on the roads, pedestrians, bicyclists, and motorists need to respect each other. Drivers should look out for pedestrians by avoiding distractions and adhering to speed limits.

Pedestrians should:

- Plan a route with safe crossings
- Avoid distractions, alcohol and drugs, and be alert



- Dress to be seen, wear reflective clothing, but never assume drivers see you
- Carry a blinking light or flashlight at night
- Walk on sidewalks and if there's no sidewalk, walk facing traffic and as far from traffic as possible
- Watch for cars backing up, especially in parking lots and driveways

When walking, pedestrians should be predictable, follow the rules of the road and obey signs and signals. They should cross at crosswalks or intersections – where drivers expect pedestrians.

While crossing, pedestrians must look for cars in all directions, including those turning left or right, and make eye contact with turning drivers before proceeding when possible.

If there is no crosswalk or intersection, pedestrians should:

- Go to a well-lit area with the best view of traffic
- · Wait until there is enough time to cross safely
- Continue to watch for traffic while crossing.

# SAINT PATRICK'S DAY BUZZED DRIVING PREVENTION - MARCH 17, 2023



St. Patrick's Day is one of the deadliest times on our nation's roads. During the 2016-2020 St. Patrick's Day holiday period (6 p.m. March 16 to 5:59 a.m. March 18), 287 lives were lost in drunk-driving crashes. In 2020, more than 11,000 people in our country died in drunk-driving crashes, and every single one of those deaths was preventable.



After the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic in early 2020, the term "supply chain logistics" became ubiquitous seemingly overnight, and news stories of container ships floating outside ports waiting for weeks to dock flooded the headlines. But the Port of Virginia recorded their two best calendar years on record for volume in 2021 and 2022, due in large part to what Virginia Port Authority CEO and Executive Director Stephen A. Edwards has termed "the Virginia model."
