HAMPTON RDS LEADS VIRGINIA METRO AREAS IN VEHICLE CRASHES

Hampton Roads led all metropolitan areas in Virginia for vehicle crashes in 2022, outstripping Richmond and Northern Virginia during a period of increasing fatal crashes statewide. Both crashes and traffic fatalities are on the rise.



The region, which encompasses such cities as Hampton, Norfolk, Chesapeake and Virginia Beach, recorded the highest rate of vehicle crashes in Virginia in 2022, at 1.8 crashes per million vehicle-miles of travel (VMT), according to a February report by the Hampton Roads Transportation Planning Organization. Hampton Roads recorded a fatal crash rate of 1.11 fatalities per 100 million VMT in the three-year period from 2019 to 2021, up 38% from 0.81 fatalities in the 2010 to 2012 time period, according to the region report.



VEHICLE THEFT FACTS AND FIGURES

More than 1,000,000 motor vehicles were stolen in 2022, with more than 250,000 reported to law enforcement during the fourth quarter alone. This is a 25% increase in vehicle theft totals over the past few years. Historically, passenger cars made up approximately 74% of all stolen motor vehicles. A motor vehicle is stolen every 32 seconds in the United States. In 2022, thieves stole more than \$8 billion in motor vehicle value.

How to Prevent Motor Vehicle Theft



- Park in well-lit areas.
- Close and lock all windows and doors when you park.
- Hide valuables out of sight, such as in the glove box or trunk.
- Do not leave your keys in your vehicle.
- Do not leave the area while your vehicle is running.
- Some vehicles come equipped with an alarm and anti-theft system, but what if yours does not? Consider purchasing extra layers of protection for your vehicle

if your manufacturer does not provide it. This could be something like an anti-theft system, which can be easily purchased online or in a store.

DSHR'S COMMERCIAL MOTOR CARRIER REGIONAL CHECK TEAM 6-13-2023

The Specialized Transportation Safety Committee's law enforcement officers get together throughout the year to hold regional commercial motor vehicle (CMV) checks. The latest event was held in Suffolk. Participating departments included CMV officers from DMV, Norfolk, Suffolk, State Police, and Virginia Beach. 35 inspections were held with 86 violations found. 1 driver was arrested on convicted felon possession firearm warrant. These officers are to be commended for working together and for keeping the roadways in Hampton Roads safer.





100 DEADLIEST DAYS OF SUMMER

How To Keep Our Teens Safe

This may be the time to relax and plan for summer fun but IT IS NOT the time to relax while driving, especially for your teens. https://wesavelives.org/100-deadliest-days-of-summer-3/

Just look at some of the facts:

- Motor vehicle crashes are the leading cause of death for teens.
- Teens between the ages of 16 and 19 have the highest crash rate of any age group.
- 60% of teen crashes today are caused by distracted driving.
- Surprisingly, the top distraction for teens is other passengers, accounting for 15% of teen driver crashes, compared to 12 % caused by texting or talking on a cell phone.
- 44% of motor vehicle crash deaths among teens ages 13–19 occurred between 9 pm and 6 am, and 50% occurred on Friday, Saturday, or Sunday in 2020.
- Among teen drivers and passengers 16–19 years of age who were killed in car crashes in 2020, 56% were not wearing a seat belt at the time of the crash.

Passengers can make a difference. They can save lives, especially their own.

HEAT SAFETY INDEX – IT'S HOT OUT THERE!

Heat index (HI) values were created for shady, light wind conditions, so exposure to full sunshine can increase heat index values by up to 15°F. The OSHA-NIOSH Heat Safety Tool is a useful resource for planning outdoor work activities based on how hot it feels throughout the day. It has a real-time heat index and hourly forecasts specific to your

location. It also provides occupational safety and health recommendations from OSHA and NIOSH. The Heat Safety Tool app is available on Google Play and the Apple Store. NOTE: This app works as well as most real-time indicators. Of course, it will not cover every situation, but it helps.
