MOCKTAIL OF THE MONTH FOR FEBRUARY 2024:

LOVE POTION MOCKTAIL

Ingredients:

- □ ½ cup fresh raspberries or substitute defrosted frozen berries
- ☐ 1 TBSP granulated sugar (optional)
- ☐ 1 TBSP lemon juice, freshly squeezed preferable (optional)
- ☐ 1 pint raspberry sherbet
- ☐ 3 cups sparkling berry lemonade, Fentimans Rose Lemonade, or regular sparkling lemonade, if you prefer.

Instructions:

Combine the fresh raspberries, granulated sugar, and lemon juice in a bowl, and mash them together with a fork until you have a berry puree. See note below.

Place a generous spoonful of puree at the bottom of 6 glasses.

Perfect for 7 oz French champagne glasses.

Top with a small scoop of raspberry sherbet, and fill the cups to the brim with sparkling berry lemonade.

Garnish with a few more fresh berries, if desired, then enjoy!

Note: If you don't like raspberry seeds in your drink, you can strain the puree through a wire mesh strainer.

DID YOU KNOW:



According to the National Highway Safety Administration, 863 children (aged 0-14) were killed in vehicle crashes in 2021 with 308 of them unrestrained. There were 8,539 unrestrained injuries for this age group. Remember to share the information on the Old, Used, Borrowed and Abused Child Safety Seat Round-Up to keep our children safe.

FEBRUARY IS CHILD SAFETY SEAT ROUND-UP TIME....

For over 35 years, Drive Safe Hampton Roads (DSHR) has joined forces with community partners to collect old, used and potentially unsafe child safety seats during the Child Safety Seat Round-Up program.

This program also serves to educate parents and caregivers about the possible dangers of using car seats past the date recommended by the manufacturer, using secondhand seats, and seats with missing parts or no traceable recall information.

As an incentive, Walmart is providing a \$5 Walmart gift card for each seat turned in (limit 2 rewards per person). Safety seats can be dropped off at Walmart Supercenter select locations (11) or at any of the eleven AAA Tidewater Virginia locations from February 1–29, 2024.

CRASH VERSUS ACCIDENT???

What is the correct word and other noteworthy changes that need to happen.

If you work in traffic safety, you are probably really good at explaining why **we call it a crash and not an accident**. We do that because words matter. Here are three other changes we need to make to our vocabulary as we enter the new year:

- 1. Died/Dies. Nobody dies in crashes. **People are killed in crashes**. Death is inevitable and it is natural. Traffic crashes are a very unnatural way to end your life. If you want people to take traffic safety more seriously, use a more serious word to describe what happens to people. The Merriam-Webster Dictionary's definition of each word show clearly why we need to make this change: Die verb, to pass from physical life: expire Kill verb, to deprive of life: cause the death of
- 2. Lives Lost. You lose your wallet, your phone, and your car keys. You do that because you truly don't know where they are and you don't know where you left them. We know where crashes happen. We know where people are killed. **Lives are taken**, they are cut short, but they are not lost tens of thousands of people did not misplace their lives on our roads last year.
- 3. Pedestrians/Bicyclists/Drivers/Motorcyclists. **There are people who walk, people who bike, people who drive, and people who ride motorcycles**. Words like "pedestrian," "cyclist," and "driver" all prioritize a mode of transportation over the person who uses it. People-first messaging can be impactful in fostering a sense of community and interconnectedness on the road.

If you already use these terms regularly, thank you- but let's shout it from the rooftops for others to do the same. If you don't, you should. The words we use shape our beliefs and behaviors. If we truly believe that traffic fatalities are unacceptable, we need to use the right words when we describe what happens!





E CHRISTOPHER KING FOUNDATION IS GEARING UP FOR SPRING EVENTS!



The Christopher King Foundation (CKF) will be speaking at a Republican Women's meeting in Williamsburg on February 14. We are trying to help educate and recruit bipartisan support to change VA's seat belt law to a primary seat belt law. Virginia is now at 74% seat belt usage, which is the worst in the country. If we can help someone champion that law, we will save over 50 lives, 700 serious injuries and \$180 million in costs. And that is just for

an 8% improvement. If we reach the nation's average of 90%, we could save even more. CKF has also been reaching out to our local government officials for help.

On February 22-24 (in Williamsburg), we will be attending Southeast Conference of Driver's Education Leaders along with Tammy McGee, Connor Gweedo Memorial Foundation. We will be sharing Christopher's story and handing out information on safe driving, alongside Tammy with Connor's story. CKF has joined the Network Peninsula who helps area nonprofits. I have already been connected with an accountant and located discounted QuickBooks and Adobe, which are huge helps. Network Peninsula also has a grants page. We've applied for 6 grants so far.

March will be busy with preparing for our annual Cars for Chris. The tentative date is May 18. This event will kick-off teen education on the 100 deadliest days of summer. CKF has 5 additional events scheduled for 2024 and will keep adding! We really appreciate DSHR's connections and resources that have helped us reach even more people and more organizations regarding seat belt usage and safe teen driving!
